

About this Trail

LEA's Maine Lake Science Center trail system winds through 18 acres of woodlands and wetlands and includes a low element challenge course. These trails connect to the abutting 66-acre woodland Pondicherry Park.


The low element challenge course stations were constructed along the Pinehaven Trail, thanks to funding from a generous local family and a grant from the Davis Conservation Foundation. The boardwalk connecting to Pondicherry Park was built by a local Eagle Scout with help from the community.

It is LEA's hope that **all** people will enjoy the beauty and recreational opportunities of the outdoors and develop a sense of place while using our trails.

Coming into Bridgton on Route 302 from Naples, turn left at the traffic light near McDonald's. Go past Hannaford and the municipal garage on the right. Cross the brook and make an immediate right into the parking area. There is additional parking at the Maine Lake Science Center.
